### **After Skin Contact:**

If on skin(on hair): Take off immediately all contaminated clothing. Rinse with water/safety shower. Call doctor if irritation persists.

# Skin:

This product can cause mild, transient skin irritation. The severity of irritation will depend on the amount of material that is applied to the skin and the speed and thoroughness that it is removed.
